

## Judging and Competition Committee

Committee Description: The Judging & Competition Committee is committed to the advancement and growth of the Annual ACS Judging & Competition ("J&C") and Awards Ceremony.

## **Roles & Responsibilities:**

- What does the committee work on? The committee coordinates with the ACS Staff on all planning of the annual judging and competition including the budget, submission process, volunteer staffing, on-site logistics, cheese receiving, judging, and more.
- What tasks do you complete each year?
  - o Determine all criteria for cheeses into J&C by ACS member cheesemakers
  - Review and amend categories
  - Establish judge roster
  - Review category entries
  - Determine the judging process, scoring guidelines, reporting, and awards criteria
  - Execute the annual Judging and Competition
  - Emcee the award ceremony
- Is any travel required? Committee members are expected to attend the Judging & Competition on-site at the conference venue. This means working Tuesday to Friday on-site first receiving entries then assisting during the judging. The amount of time you can expect to be away from work would be 4-7 days for the entire event (this does not include time off for conference)

## Time Commitment:

- What months are busiest? March- May: for entry review, and execution of the competition
- How many hours are generally expected of a committee member each month? Up to 4 hours a month (1 hour call weekly) plus additional sub-committee work (up to another 6 hours/month)
- How long are members expected to participate on the committee? Members on J&C do not have term limits

## **Current Meeting Schedule:**

- Calls are scheduled weekly for one hour- and alternate between full committee and subcommittees. Meetings are currently Thursdays from 10:30am CT 11:30am CT
- Committee members are required to attend 80% of meetings and can miss no more than 6 full committee and 4 subcommittee calls per year. Committee members are also required to attend the annual competition.
